Plug-ups of wastewater pumps. The Public Works Department has experienced multiple plug-ups at wastewater pumping stations due to rags, cleaning towels, toilet wipes that claim to be flushable, clothing, diapers, paper towels, and even mop heads. These products do not disintegrate or break down easily when flushed. Flushing these items may result in plugging your own pipes and has resulted in re-occurring failure of wastewater pumps. The hours of maintenance needed to dismantle and repair the pumps increases operational costs. All materials such as rags, cleaning towels or disposable wipes, baby wipes or toilet wipes that claim to be flushable, clothing, diapers, etc. must be placed in a garbage receptacle—not the toilet or other wastewater drain.
